INVESTMENT FUND IMPACT

Business financing is available up to \$250,000 for start-up, relocation, business purchase, maintenance or expansions located within Trenval's service area. Trenval's financing can be independent or in a partnership with other financial institutions such as the Business Development Bank of Canada and Futurpreneur.

Rural Innovation Initiative Eastern Ontario (RIJEO)



The Rural Innovation Initiative Eastern Ontario (RIIEO) is made possible with funding from the Federal Economic Development Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario) to support the transition and growth of traditional SMEs, manufacturers and communities into the new rural economy, driving direct investments by private companies in innovation capital producing aggregate local and regional effects. The total contribution to Eastern Ontario is \$15 million over 2 years (2019-2021), with one regional stream and local streams delivered by 15 Community Futures offices.

The local RIIEO stream of \$750,000 administered by Trenval, provides non-repayable performance-based funding to expanding businesses who are accessing new markets or adopting advanced business innovation processes. The program identifies priority sectors that include advanced manufacturing, clean tech, digital industries and agri-food processing.

Regional Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF)

The Regional Relief and Recovery Fund (RRRF) provides financial contributions (interest-free loans) to help support fixed operating costs of SMEs, where business revenues have been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Fund, valued at more than \$962 million nationally, is delivered by Canada's six regional development agencies. In Southern Ontario, \$213 million is available through FedDev Ontario and \$39.4M for rural businesses delivered by Southern Ontario's Community Futures Development Corporations. Close to \$1 million has been allocated to Trenval.

Trenval is administering these funds to local "main street" businesses in our catchment area such as retail shops, restaurants, dry cleaners, health services and cafes with loans up to \$40,000 until all the allocated funding has been exhausted. Trenval anticipates assisting an additional 25 business on top of the 17 business already assisted with low interest loans at the beginning of the pandemic.

With this financial support and technical business counselling support, as well as other Federal and Provincial support, we hope to see our region's businesses recover and once again become a resilient and healthy business community.

Trenval is the managing partner of the Small Business Centre (SBC), one of 57 offices across Ontario. Trenval manages the SBC through the City of Belleville and is funded by the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade (MEDJCT). The SBC also receives financial operating support from the City of Belleville, City of Quinte West, Trenval and Quinte Economic Development Commission.

The SBC is Trenval's largest CED project to date offering in-kind support and management since 2012. Luc Fourier and Brianna Rossit deliver small business counselling and information services to businesses adding to the economic impact within the region.

In addition to counselling and information services the SBC delivers workshops, events and webinars to small business and administers the Starter Plus and Summer Company programs which offer grants, business planning and mentorship.
